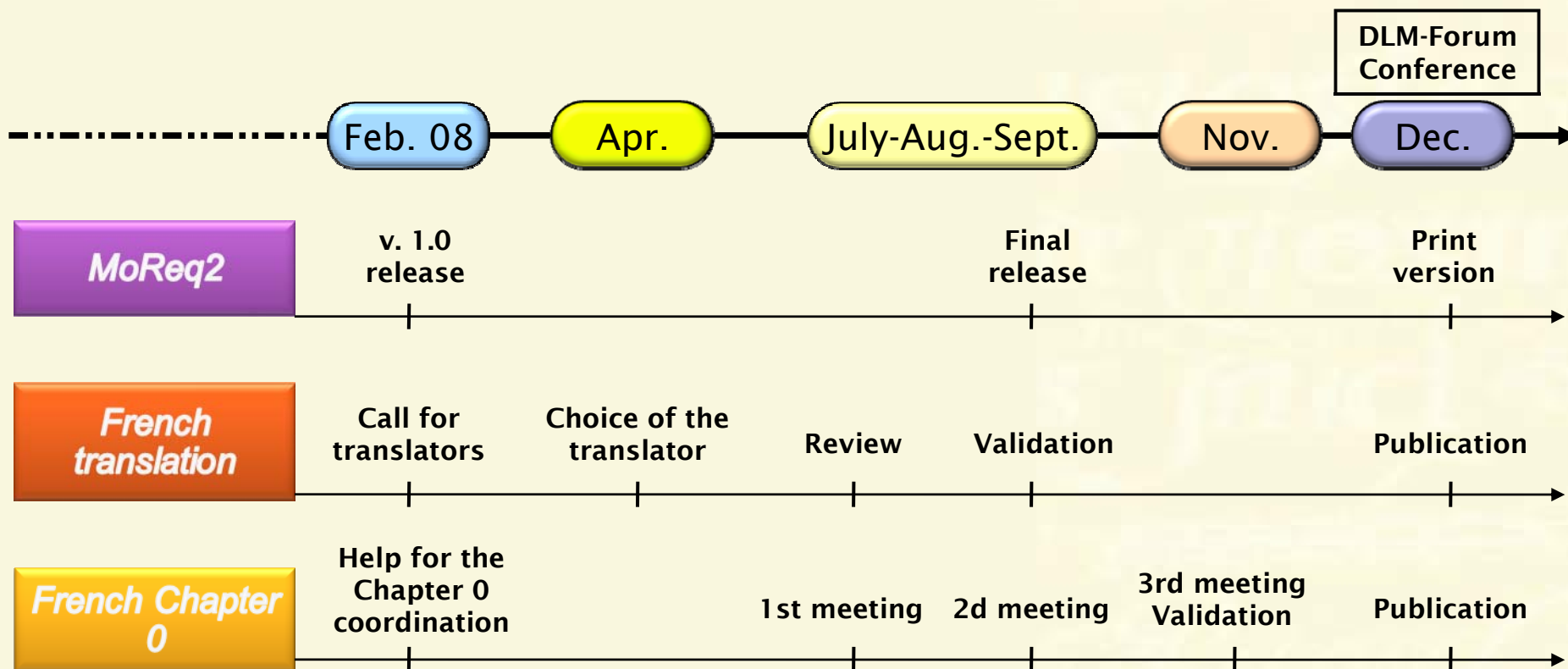
Institutionnal organization
